Hema Singaraddi – Women's Representative

The Women's Representative apologised for absence and said she's been brainstorming for International Women's Day (would like to have a letter box for people to write a letter for their favourite woman and would like to host a session with female entrepreneurs). A discussion took place regarding the Women's Rep's commitment to the role along with further questioning by other members present regarding plans for their remaining term.' The Women's Rep stated she is now in position to fully commit to the role and plans to collaborate with other reps and Strath Union staff on IWD and other projects. She also committed to giving a progress update at the next parliament.

13 representatives voted in favour of her maintaining position as Women's Representation, no votes against.

4. Any Other Competent Business (AOCB)

Democracy Convener

a. Trustee Update on BDS Policy

CEO

In November 2023, student parliament passed a motion on Palestine that involved a review of policies and organisations. The following decisions were made:

- HP: The union uses the university's IT system but the union will look at influencing the university to change their supplier.
- Amazon: used quite frequently by societies due to how quickly items can be delivered. There will be a full review of the use of Amazon to see if plans can be made in advance and more sustainable suppliers are used. VP Education has been looking into some ethical suppliers and will continue this research.
- Coca-Cola/Schweppes spent a long time looking at how much is used and what alternatives are out there. The bar staff did an alternative taste test over the summer

and the results weren't promising – and alternative options are about 50% more expensive than Coca-Cola. Strath Union has about 90 members of student staff but this number would have to be reduced should a switch be made so the board has decided to not progress this.

- Pepsi, Walkers and Doritos These products have been removed from sale and an alternative supplier has been brought in.
- Domino's Domino's is part of an agreement that most SUs are part of so will have quite a negative impact on contract if we were to remove them. Native, the outsourced advertising supplier that brings Domino's in, are looking into this themselves.

b. Trustee Update on Glasgow & Clyde Rape Crisis (GCRC)

CEO

- At the last student parliament, two motions were passed. One was about signing the joint NUS x Glasgow School of Art statement and the second was about uninviting Glasgow and Clyde Rape Crisis from FFTN.
- Morna, Strath Union CEO, briefed the university on the conversations had at student parliament.
- GCRC are having conversations with the University, and we will be updated on the outcome.
- Morna noted that there has been a lack of clarity between what GCRC say their intentions are and what has been reported.
